These programs are exclusively for Cub Scouts graduating from the 2<sup>ND</sup> grade.

### COST

The cost of the weekend is \$31 per person, which pays for two meals, overnight accommodations, program, and a souvenir. Dinner on Saturday and breakfast on Sunday are served in the camp, which is hosting the event. The parent and Cub will stay in tents left up from the previous week of camp. The fee of \$31 per person is not refundable after February 1, 2010.

Leadership for the weekend will be provided by the pack. Each boy should be accompanied by a "parent". A single parent "lad" could come with another parent, but no more than two lads per parent.

Highlights of the weekend program include archery, BB gun range, swimming, canoeing, fishing (Lewallen and S-F only), and a campfire. Boating requires swimming ability (100 yards).

Programs are designed as "Dads Only" or "Moms Only". Mom and Me programs were developed for single parent Cubs. Spots available at Mom & Me after February 1 are open sign-up.

Programs are open to Tiger Cubs and Webelos after February 1 depending on available spots.

***If you do not receive your first choice of dates fees are refundable until February 1, 2010.*** After February 1, fees are not refundable. **Packs that get there first choice of dates are not eligible for a refund.**

### WANT TO GO! HERE'S HOW

If you want to participate in the fun and adventure of a weekend together, talk to your Cubmaster and tell him you wish to go.
